

Our School and Community

- Founded in 1871.
- Private, all-boys, day school.
- 7-12 grade school (HS: 10-12).
- MEXT accredited, the language of instruction at Kaisei is Japanese.
- Located in Arakawa-ku, one of Tokyo's most densely populated districts.
- Historically ranked as the top school in all of Japan, Kaisei is the alma matter of many illustrious alumni, including the former Prime Minister, Fumio Kishida.

School Context

- Admission to Kaisei is based on competitive entrance examinations
- Student population: 2100 (JHS: 900, HS: 1200)
- Kaisei has the nation's highest matriculation of students to Japan's top university and medical schools (averaging 35% matriculation rate at the University of Tokyo since 1982)

At Kaisei, students follow the national curriculum and are expected to graduate with anywhere from 96 to 100 credits depending on their chosen track of study (the humanities or the sciences track).

Besides taking part in academic competitions, Kaisei students normally commit to active participation in a school competitive club (athletics, martial arts, or academic) or circle (centered around a common hobby) throughout their 3 years of high school. There are currently 70 clubs at Kaisei, each headed by a student captain – a role that functions sometimes as a coach and caretaker in the Japanese school system. Students are also members of multiple committees at Kaisei, overseeing the budget and organization of events such as the Sports Festival, the Culture Festival, excursion and service trips (domestic and abroad), as well as discipline and campus cleaning committees. All these committees are then overseen and managed by the student council.

One of the key events of the school year, and which Kaisei is well-known for, is the Sports Festival which is wholly organized and run by students. The highlight of the event is the *Botaoshi*, a game combining elements of rugby, sumo and martial arts (see NY Times, "The Organized Chaos of Botaoshi, Japan's Wildest Game" Aug. 22, 2018).
